**ORDINANCE NO. 2017-17**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE 2017-2018 FISCAL YEAR HALF-CENT FUND BUDGET AND CAPITAL OUTLAY BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE FRENCHTOWN ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS**

WHEREAS, the Council and Mayor of the City of Central desires to make road improvements for a portion of Frenchtown Road;

WHEREAS, the design work was completed and the City of Central has received bids for construction costs related to the desired road improvements for a portion of Frenchtown Road;

WHEREAS, the costs for the road improvements for a portion of Frenchtown Road will be \$1,651,899.10 and Council did not include funding for the construction costs within the 2017-18 Half-Cent Fund or Capital Outlay Fund;

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Central desires to amend the 2017-2018 Fiscal Year Half-Cent Fund and Capital Outlay Fund to properly appropriate necessary funds related to the above stated matters.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Central, State of Louisiana as follows:

**Section 1.** Transfer to CO&I Fund - Construction (Half-Cent Fund Account No. 120.491.21.100) is hereby increased by \$1,651,899.10 for the transfer of funds to the Capital Outlay Fund for construction costs related to the Frenchtown Road improvements (Greenwell Springs Road to Central Thruway).

**Section 2.** Transfer from HC Fund – Construction (Capital Outlay Fund Account No. 210.391.20.100) is hereby increased by \$1,651,899.10 to provide for transfer of funds from the Half Cent Fund to the Capital Outlay Fund for construction costs related to the Frenchtown Road improvements (Greenwell Springs Road to Central Thruway)

**Section 3.** HC – Road Construction (Capital Outlay Fund Account No. 210.431.10.730) is hereby increased by \$1,651,899.10 to provide for the construction costs related to the Frenchtown Road improvements (Greenwell Springs Road to Central Thruway)

**Section 4. Conflicts**

The specific terms and conditions of this Ordinance shall prevail against prior ordinances of the City to the extent that there may be any conflict.

**Section 5. Severability**

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such declaration of invalidity shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or parts thereof, other than the part declared invalid. The remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected by the declaration of invalidity and shall remain in force and effect.

**Section 6. Effective Date**

This Ordinance shall be effective upon publication.




