ORDINANCE NO. 2019-08

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE 2018-2019 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE UP TO \$64,000 TO EXPAND THE SCOPE OF THE DRAINAGE STUDY FOR THE DRAINAGE MASTER PLAN AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS

WHEREAS, the current drainage study being completed by CSRS of the six primary drainage channels in the City of Central: Shoe Creek, Hub Bayou, Draughan Creek, Saunders Bayou, Beaver Bayou, and Blackwater Bayou is based on modeling of the effects of a 25-year rain event;

WHEREAS, the purpose of the study is to develop a Drainage Master Plan for planning, repairing, improving and maintaining drainage infrastructure in the City of Central;

WHEREAS, Beaver Bayou and Blackwater Bayou which are tributaries to the Amite River are included within an East Baton Rouge Parish drainage project to be designed by the United States Army Corps of Engineers;

WHEREAS, CSRS has estimated that expanding the scope of the drainage study to be based on modeling of the effects of a 50-year rain event for each channel ("Phase II") will take approximately two weeks per channel and will cost approximately \$16,000 per channel;

WHEREAS, Phase II can be completed sequentially by modeling the effects of a 50-year rain event on one channel and then evaluating the fiscal impact of increasing planning, repairing, improving and maintaining infrastructure for a 50-year rain event to determine whether to proceed with modeling the effects of a 50-year rain event for the next channel;

WHEREAS, CSRS has recommended that the 50-year modeling be conducted in the following order: Shoe Creek, Hub Bayou, Draughan Creek and Saunders Bayou;

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Central desires to expand the scope of the drainage study of the channels, not included within the East Baton Rouge Parish drainage project to determine the feasibility of planning, repairing, improving and maintaining drainage infrastructure in the City of Central based on modeling of the effects of a 50-year rain event;

WHEREAS, the delivery of the drainage study will not be delayed by the addition of Phase II to the study;

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Central has determined that proceeding with Phase II prior to delivery of the drainage study is in the best interest of the citizens and property owners; and

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Central desires to amend the 2018-19 Fiscal Year Emergency Services, Drainage & Local Road Improvement & Maintenance (ESDLRIM) Fund Budget to appropriate funds for Phase II of the drainage study;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Central, State of Louisiana as follows:

Section 1. Budget Amendment

Drainage (ESDLRIM Fund Expenditure Account No. 110.431.60.000) is hereby increased by \$64,000.00 for Phase II of the drainage study for the Drainage Master Plan. Expenditures for Phase II shall require a notice to proceed with the modeling for the designated drainage channel approved by the Mayor.

Section 2. Conflicts

The specific terms and conditions of this Ordinance shall prevail against other Ordinances of the City to the extent that there may be any conflict.

Section 3. Severability

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such declaration of invalidity shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or parts thereof, other than the part declared invalid. The remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected by the declaration of invalidity and shall remain in force and effect.

Section 4. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall be effective upon publication.




