ORDINANCE NO. 2019-50

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE 2019-2020 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR APPRAISAL FEES RELATED TO THE PURCHASE OF A FUTURE CITY HALL PROPERTY AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS

WHEREAS, the City of Central was awarded Capital Outlay funding from the State of Louisiana for the construction of a City Hall; and

WHEREAS, the administration for the City of Central expects to soon select and recommend property for the construction of a City Hall, parking lot, and future facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Central wishes to allocate funds for the appraisal costs of property recommended for a future City Hall, and that funds for this expenditure were not provided in the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year Capital Outlay & Improvement Fund Budget;

WHEREAS, the Council for the City of Central desires to amend the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year Capital Outlay & Improvement Fund Budget to appropriate necessary funds related to the above-stated matters.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Central, State of Louisiana as follows:

Section 1. Building Construction (Capital Outlay & Improvement Fund Expenditure Account No. 210.400.10.000) is hereby increased by \$4,000.00 to provide for expenditures related to the appraisal fees of property recommended for a City Hall Building and related facilities.

Section 2. Transfer from General Fund (Capital Outlay & Improvement Fund Revenue Account No. 210.391.00.100) is hereby increased by \$4,000.00 to provide for expenditures related to the appraisal fees of property recommended for a City Hall Building and related facilities.

Section 3. Transfer to Capital Outlay & Improvement Fund (General Fund Expenditure Account No. 000.491.21.200) is hereby increased by \$4,000.00 to provide for expenditures related to the appraisal fees of property recommended for a City Hall Building and related facilities.

Section 4. Conflicts

The specific terms and conditions of this Ordinance shall prevail against other ordinances of the City to the extent that there may be any conflict.

Section 5. Severability

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such declaration of invalidity shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or parts thereof, other than the part declared invalid. The remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected by the declaration of invalidity and shall remain in force and effect.

Section 6. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall be effective upon publication.


