**ORDINANCE 2020 - 33**

**TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE THIBODEAUX  
ROAD IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT  
STATE PROJECT H.013546  
FEDERAL AID PROJECT H013546  
THIBODEAUX ROAD IMPROVEMENTS**

WHEREAS, the City of Central has an agreement to finance a portion of the construction of the above reference PROJECT through the use of Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development (DOTD) funds using 20% local funds and 80% federal funds;

WHEREAS, DOTD received bids on the referenced project on October 21, 2020, and the low bidder was R.J. Daigle & Sons Contractors, Inc. in the amount of \$940,352.23;

WHEREAS, there are funds previously transferred from the Half Cent Sales Tax Fund to the Capital Outlay & Improvement Fund in excess of the project costs for the previously completed Frenchtown Road Project and the Council for the City of Central would like to reallocate those funds to the PROJECT equal to the 20% of local funds required in the amount of \$188,070.45;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council for the City of Central as follows:

**Section 1. Budget Amendment**

Federal Grant-Capital (Capital Outlay & Improvement Fund Account 210.331.30) is hereby increased by \$800,000.00 for federal funds to be received for 80% construction costs related to the PROJECT which includes funds for unforeseen minor change orders that may occur.

HC – Road Construction (Capital Outlay & Improvement Fund Account 210.431.10.730) is hereby increased by \$200,000.00 for 20% of the construction costs related to the PROJECT which includes funds for unforeseen minor change orders that may occur.

Road Construction (Capital Outlay & Improvement Fund Account 210.431.10.100) is hereby increased by \$800,000.00 for 80% of the construction costs related to the PROJECT which includes funds for unforeseen minor change orders that may occur.

**Section 2. Conflicts**

The specific terms and conditions of this Ordinance shall prevail against other Ordinances of the City to the extent that there may be any conflict.

**Section 3. Severability**

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such declaration of invalidity shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or parts thereof, other than the part declared invalid. The remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected by the declaration of invalidity and shall remain in force and effect.

**Section 4. Effective Date**

This Ordinance shall be effective upon publication.


