ORDINANCE NO. 2019-37

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE 2019-2020 FISCAL YEAR BUDGET TO RECOGNIZE THE DONATION OF UNIT 106 AND \$10,000 IN REVENUE FROM THE SALE OF SURPLUS AND TO APPROPRIATE THE PROCEEDS TO REPAIRS AND MAINTENANCE OF POLICE DEPARTMENT VEHICLES AND TO PROVIDE FOR RELATED MATTERS

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 2019-50 the Council declared Central Police Department Unit 106 as surplus and authorized Unit 106 to be donated to the Town of Clinton Police Department;

WHEREAS, the value of Unit 106 was \$482 at the time of the donation and requires an amendment to the General Fund Budget for the 2019-2020 fiscal year;

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 2019-34, the Council declared two Central Police Department motorcycles as surplus and authorized the motorcycles to be sold;

WHEREAS, the motorcycles were sold to the Church Point Police Department for \$5,000 each;

WHEREAS, the sale of the motorcycles for \$10,000 requires an amendment to the General Fund Budget for the 2019-2020 fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, several Central Police Department vehicles are in need of repair and the Council desires to dedicate the proceeds of the sale of the two motorcycles to repairs and maintenance of Central Police Department vehicles.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Central, State of Louisiana as follows:

Section 1. Donation of Central Police Department Unit 106

Increase Donation of PD Vehicles (General Fund Expenditure Account No. 000-421.70.745) by \$482.

Increase Gain on Disposal of Asset-PD (General Fund Revenue Account No. 000-370.20) by \$482.

Section 2. Proceeds of Sale of Motorcycles dedicated to Repairs and Maintenance of Central Police Department Vehicles

Increase Gain on Disposal of Assets-PD (General Fund Revenue Account No. 000-370.20) by \$10,000.

Increase Repairs & Maintenance-Vehicles (General Fund Expenditure Account No. 000-421.70.430) by \$10,000.

Section 3. Conflicts

The specific terms and conditions of this Ordinance shall prevail against prior ordinances of the City to the extent there is any conflict.

Section 4. Severability

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provision of this Ordinance is declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such declaration of invalidity shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or parts thereof, other than the part declared invalid. The remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected by the declaration of invalidity and shall remain in force and effect.

Section 5. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall be effective upon publication.
